



LERU Doctoral Summer School

Essential Enterprise Skills for Early Career Researchers

17th - 22nd July 2011

The second annual LERU Doctoral Summer School will be hosted by University College London, focusing on the theme of Entrepreneurship. During the week participants will develop the knowledge and attributes required to successfully take a business idea forward, whether that is within an academic or a business environment and from scientific or humanities domains. Participants will be given some initial training, followed by project work in cross-disciplinary teams on a business idea focused around one of the global challenges such as climate change, energy, ageing, population growth, urbanisation or food security. Experts in areas such as intellectual property and resource management will be on hand to support the teams in their work and provide some formal learning input throughout the duration of the summer school. At the end of the week, each team will present their business idea to a panel of professionals. During the business plan development, participants will be encouraged to produce a video diary of their activities which will not only harness creative energy but also enhance the learning experience by demonstrating the process each team went through to get to their end result.

Participant requirements

Participants will be selected by their institution. They are preferably well advanced in their PhD projects and keenly motivated to work on the topic of the summer school. Participants must be available for the whole duration of the summer school. The days will be full and long. Candidates must be prepared to participate in all activities in the programme. The sessions will all be conducted in English and therefore fluency in written and spoken English is essential.

Application (deadline: 15 April 2011) and selection

Each LERU university is invited to select one or more candidates to participate in the summer school. The top candidate from each LERU university is guaranteed a place. Additional participants (maximum 40 in total) will be selected by the host university from the candidate pool based on merit and other criteria. Names of the candidate(s) should be sent by the designated contact person at each LERU university to Mrs Veerle Van Kerckhove at LERU (veerle.vankerckhove@leru.org) no later than 15 April 2011. Besides the candidates' names, the following information should also be included: their rank order for acceptance, their contact details, discipline/title of research project and optionally their cv or application letter for the summer school. It should also be indicated to whom (name and address) the invoice for the attendance cost (£375 - see below) should be sent. This could be the doctoral candidate, the designated contact person or another person at the sending university.

Letters of acceptance will be sent out no later than 15 May 2011.

Cost

Cost of attendance is £375. This will include all course materials, accommodation (Sunday night to Thursday night) and all food (breakfast, lunch and dinner) from dinner on Sunday night to lunch on Friday. Candidates will be expected to pay for their travel to UCL and additional costs for social activities undertaken.
